On December 5, 2017, the San Diego State University Senate approved the following item—which was subject to meet-and-confer with the staff bargaining units. Discussions are now concluded and below is the item in its original format and as revised (additional closing sentence). Note that discussions continue with the CFA on the faculty version (which is far more complex).

Item 7.1 Report of the Committee on Academic Policy and Planning

The Committee approved AP&P's report, which called for adding a new policy for staff about academic misconduct; the change stems from updates to NCAA regulations in this area, and more briefly mirrors Senate-approved revisions to the policy for faculty.

University Policies: Staff Original

- Academic misconduct: Staff shall not provide students with unethical academic assistance, including but not limited to: providing or arranging for the provision of
 - copies of a test, an examination, or other course material to any student without the permission of the instructor;
 - fraudulent academic credit or false transcripts regarding an individual's academic record; and (b)
 - an academic exception that results in a grade change, academic credit, or fulfillment of a graduation requirement when such an exception is not available to all students.

Revised

University Policies: Staff

Any disciplinary action will be administered in accordance with the Education Code and applicable Collective Bargaining Agreement.
