Concern raised that it may not be a good idea for URP to abandon their role in shared governance. URP noted they are willing to work with McCall / CAA about finding a new way for URP to participate, after URP is removed from the review process. Another concern was raised that removing URP before understanding how the oversight might occur may not be in the best interest of the Senate/university. McCall noted that URP was moved to an early place in the process, this is the first year. McCall is open to discussing the placement or timing of review. McCall is reluctant to remove all faculty oversight of new programs, etc. McCall also clarified that all other steps except new program review were removed this year already.
