1.1. Land Acknowledgement

It is the land of the Kumeyaay.

1.2. SDSU University Senate Resolution on Principles of Shared Governance, April 9, 2019

WHEREAS: Shared governance is a system of partnership, equity, accountability, and ownership that forms a culturally sensitive, inclusive, and empowering framework for developing and implementing sustainable and accountability-based decisions in service to all members of our campus and broader communities; and...

WHEREAS: Shared governance is an ongoing process in which faculty, staff, students, and

administrators actively engage to share responsibility for 1) identifying and pursuing an aligned set of mission-driven sustainable outcomes and priorities and 2) active monitoring and evaluating of shared governance successes and pitfalls in service to continual improvement and the embodiment of a learning organization; and...

WHEREAS: A shared practice of, and shared commitment to, respect, communication, and responsibility will promote and support the growth and sustainment of trustworthiness within our University community...

Chair Butler Byrd reminded senators to review the Shared Governance Resolution.

Motion (Madanat) to update this policy passed (16 Y | 0 N | 1 Abstain). Lach suggests an editorial change to update language on how these are stored in the library. Madanat accepted this editorial change. Reed agreed to provide the exact updated policy language to the Senate Secretary for inclusion in the policy file.

Additionally, **Lach** raised some concerns about metadata sharing and "embargo" theses or "confidential" theses. **Madanat** views the issue of storage and metadata as a procedural issue and that there is a separate policy and procedural guide that will note how this implementation will happen.
