The CBL moves that the Senate adopt the following update to Bylaws 2 and [for a first reading](#).

2.0 Committees

*****Subsections 2.1-2.3 were addressed in a separate Action Item***
(these replace 2.1 and 2.2 in the current policy file)**

2.4. Appointments

2.4.1. Unless otherwise stipulated, authorities for nomination to Senate and Senate Ad-Hoc Committees, as well as Senate-appointed members of Senate-affiliated Campus Committees, shall be as follows: (a) faculty by the Senate Committee on Committees and Elections, (b) **contingent faculty to occupy contingent faculty seats by the Lecturer Affairs Committee**, (c) administrators by the university administration, **(ed)** staff by the Staff Affairs Committee, and **(de)** students by the Associated Students, who shall verify that nominated students are in good academic standing.

2.4.2. The Senate shall approve all nominees.

2.4.2.1. The Senate Committee on Committees and Elections shall typically organize committee appointment nominees and present them to the Senate as an action item.

2.4.2.2. If the Committee on Committees and Elections is

unable to fill verified vacancies for a committee, the Senate Chair shall have the authority to organize and present nominations for the committee and present them as an action item to the Senate. The Senate Chair shall make reasonable attempts to consult with the nominating authority.

2.4.3. All elected senators listed in Constitution 4.0 shall serve on a Senate or Senate-affiliated Campus Committee.

2.4.4. In filling vacancies, the Committee on Committees and Elections shall observe the following rules:

2.4.4.1. Senator committee appointments shall take priority over appointments of non-Senators.

2.4.4.2. Committee members are not required to be senators.

2.4.4.3. Faculty in the Faculty Early Retirement Program (FERP) may only occupy designated "faculty" seats during active employment.

2.4.5. No member can occupy two seats on the same committee at the same time, including substitutes.

~~2.3 Times of Nomination and Appointment. The Committee on Committees and Elections shall be constituted for the upcoming academic year at the final regularly scheduled Senate meeting of the previous academic year. The committee shall have presented a full slate of nominees to Senate and Senate-appointed committees by the last Senate meeting of each academic year.~~

2.5. Terms of Service

2.5.1. Unless otherwise specified committee members shall serve three-year terms.

~~2.3.1.~~2.5.2. All terms of office begin June 1, or at the time of appointment, and conclude May 31 in the final year of the term.

2.5.3. The Committee of Committees and Elections shall strive to prepare a full slate of nominees by the last Senate meeting of each academic year.

2.5.4. A committee member may be nominated for reappointment.

2.5.5. During a committee's initial three years, or as needed to ensure term staggering that is healthy for the continuity of the committee, the Committee on Committees and Elections shall specify members with one-, two-, and three-year seats.

2.5.6. Removal

2.5.6.1. The seat of an appointed committee member shall become vacant when the individual (a) resigns, (b) becomes an ex officio member of the committee, (c) is absent with or without representation for more than half of the regular scheduled meetings during an academic year, (d) becomes ineligible due to change in classification or job status, or (e) separates from the university.

2.5.6.2. An appointed Senate committee member shall be removed when an individual occupies seats in multiple committees and the Committee on Committees and Elections needs to accommodate a Senator who lacks a committee assignment.

2.5.6.3. The Senate Executive Committee can remove an appointed committee member for cause.

2.5.6.4. The Committee on Committees and Elections

shall nominate a replacement member following policy outlined in Bylaws 6.0.

2.5.6.5. The Committee on Committees and Elections shall report to the Senate when a member is removed.

2.46. Referrals

2.46.1. Items shall be referred to committees by the Senate Chair, in consultation with the other Senate officers, by the Senate Executive Committee, or by the Senate. An item referred to a committee by the **Senate** Executive Committee shall be referred to another committee only through the **Senate** Executive Committee.

2.46.2. Items shall be referred to existing committees whenever possible.

2.46.3. The Senate Chair's additional communications to committees regarding referred items shall be reported at the next Senate Executive Committee meeting.

2.6.4. The Senate Vice Chair shall make regular updates to the Senate Executive Committee and the Senate regarding progress and status of all referrals.

~~2.4.4. A committee may use subcommittees or may invite non-voting members to participate in its work.~~

~~2.5. Records and Reports~~

~~2.5.1. Each committee chair shall transmit records and pertinent information to the incoming chair.~~

~~2.5.2. Each Senate and Senate-appointed committees shall submit a summary report of its activities annually by May 1.~~

~~2.6. Committee Operation~~

~~2.6.1. Rules: Senate rules shall apply to the operation of Senate or Senate appointed university committees. Exceptions to these rules may be noted in~~

~~sec. 25 of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised. Specific stipulations for a given committee regarding authority, tenure, duration, scope, and objectives shall be available in the Senate office.~~

2.6.2.7. Committee Chairs

2.6.2.7.1. Election

~~: Unless otherwise specified committees shall elect a chair annually~~

2.7.1.1. Voting committee members shall elect a chair for the next academic year by April 1. ~~for the upcoming academic year.~~

2.7.1.2. The current chair shall ~~will~~ oversee the election. ~~The voting members of the committee shall elect the chair, The Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections and the Secretary of the Senate shall be notified and included in the committee's annual report, or when any change in committee leadership occurs.~~

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2.7.2. Eligibility

2.7.2.1. Appointed members of a committee are eligible to serve as chair, unless otherwise specified in the charter

2.7.2.2. Whenever possible, the chair shall be an elected senator.

~~2.6.2.2:~~ 2.7.2.3. An ex officio member shall not be named chair unless ~~otherwise specified~~ explicitly stated in the committee's charter.

2.7.2.4. No individual shall be elected to chair more than one Senate committee.

2.7.2.5. Senate Officers may not be elected to chair a Senate Core Committee.

2.7.3. Unless otherwise specified in the charter, the term of service

for a chair is for one year.

~~2.6.2.3.~~7.4. If no member of the committee is willing to serve as chair, the Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections or the Chair of the Senate shall appoint a new chair, which ~~This appointment~~ may result in a member of the committee being replaced to accommodate the appointed chair. ~~by a chair from outside the committee.~~

~~2.6.2.4.~~7.5. A chair can be vacated by a majority vote of the entire voting membership of the committee.

~~2.6.2.5.~~7.6. When the chair is vacated before the expiration of a term, the remaining committee members elect a new chair.

2.7.6. The Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections and the Secretary of the Senate shall be notified when any change in committee leadership occurs.

2.7.7. The Committee of Committees and Election will present the elected chair to the Senate for ratification.

2.8. Committee Operation

2.8.1. Rules

2.8.1.1. Senate rules shall apply to the operation of Senate Committees, unless specified otherwise in the committee's charter.

~~2.6.3.~~8.2. Meetings and Quorum

2.8.2.1. Senate Committees shall meet at minimum once per year. Senate Core Committees shall meet at minimum four times per semester.

2.8.2.2. Meetings shall be called by the chair, who shall preside over the meeting.

2.8.2.3. Should the chair fail or decline to call meetings with sufficient frequency to accomplish committee objectives, two members may call a meeting, provided that all members

including the chair are given at least three working days' notice.

2.8.2.4. Committee votes may be completed via technological means, and outside of regularly scheduled committee meetings, at the discretion of the chair. Quorum rules apply to asynchronous votes.

2.8.2.5. Senate Committees shall make their meeting agendas and minutes available:

2.8.2.5.1. Agendas should be provided to committee members no later than four working days before a meeting, and upon request to others.

2.8.2.5.2. Minutes should be made available to the Senate as soon as they are approved.

2.8.2.6. The chair of the committee shall keep records of all actions of the committee.

~~A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum of a committee.~~

2.6.48.3. Hearings and Deliberations

2.8.3.1. A committee should, where time permits, hear all testimony relevant to its assignment.

2.8.3.2. A committee should consult with all relevant constituencies, in particular when these are not represented among their membership.

2.8.3.3. All meetings shall be open to the university community unless called into executive session by the chair for purposes in concert with current statutory requirements for open meetings. The chair's decision to call an executive session shall be subject to challenge and may be overruled by a majority of the committee members present.

~~2.6.5. Record of Proceedings: The chair of the committee shall keep records of all actions of the committee or shall ensure that they be kept by a committee secretary. The agenda for each committee meeting should be made available in the Senate office at least three working days in advance of~~

~~the meeting. Persons wishing to be heard on an item should notify the chair of the committee.~~

2.8.4. Reports

2.8.4.1 Committees authorized by the Senate shall report to the Senate.

2.8.4.2. Senate-affiliated Campus Committees may report to the Senate. If the Senate Chair, Senate Executive Committee or the Senate may request a report from a Senate-affiliated Campus Committee, that committee shall provide such a report.

2.8.4.3. Reports made to the Senate are typically in the form of a written memorandum, as an Action or Information Item.

2.8.4.3.1. Action Item: A report that contains items requiring clarification, deliberation, and/or a vote by the Senate. If an Action Item is adopted by unanimous consent or a passing vote, it shall become policy pending approval by the President of the university. A Resolution is a type of Action Item, a formal written motion that requires a majority vote.

2.8.4.3.2. Information Item: A report that contains information only, and on which no action by the Senate is required. An Information Item can become an Action Item by a majority vote.

2.8.4.4. If a report contains statements of opinion, these should be stated at the end of the report as part of the Rationale.

2.8.4.5. Senate Core Committees shall report to every regular scheduled Senate meeting.

2.8.4.6. Each Senate Committee shall submit an Annual Agenda.

2.8.4.6.1. The Annual Agenda should be accepted by a majority vote of the committee.

2.8.4.6.2. Once approved by the committee, the chair shall submit the committee's Annual Agenda to the

Senate by the submission deadline for the October senate meeting.

2.8.4.6.3. The Annual Agenda should include all active referrals and can include other items if they relate to the committee's function, as outlined in the committee charter. If the committee anticipates an inability to complete all items within the current academic year, priorities may be indicated.

2.8.4.7. Each Senate Committee shall submit an Annual Report.

2.8.4.7.1. The Annual Report shall include:

2.8.4.7.1.1. The elected chair for the upcoming academic year. If no chair is elected, the outgoing chair shall report this to the Senate Secretary and Committee of Committees and Elections Chair.

2.8.4.7.1.2. An updated membership roster for the upcoming academic year that clearly outlines term renewals, temporary replacement status (e.g. will the original member return), and vacancies.

2.8.4.7.1.3. A list of Action Items (including Resolutions) submitted to the Senate and their status (e.g., approved, rejected, or pending).

2.8.4.7.1.4. A list of active referrals accompanied by progress notes for each.

2.8.6.1.5 A general discussion of the committee's work, including collaboration with other Senate, Senate-affiliated or non-Senate committees on campus, as well as a general summary of accomplishments and opportunities/areas for future work not covered elsewhere.

2.8.7.4.2. The Annual Report should be accepted by a majority vote of the committee.

2.8.7.4.3. Once approved by the committee, the Annual Report shall be submitted by the deadline for the May Senate Meeting. If the committee wishes to modify the report after this

submission for any reason, they may submit a revised version for the September meeting of the upcoming academic year.

~~2.6.6. Reporting: All Senate and Senate-appointed committees shall report to the Senate. Committees that do not report directly to the Senate may be invited to the Senate to discuss or clarify their activities. The type of report will depend on the status of the committee or body and the nature of its task.~~

~~2.6.6.1. — If the report contains information only, no action by the Senate is required, but may be moved to the floor for action by a majority vote.~~

~~2.6.6.2. — If the report contains statements of policy or opinion, these should be stated at the end of the report, and the proper motion is to accept the report. If accepted, the policies or opinions shall become those of the Senate.~~

~~2.6.6.3. — If the report contains resolutions or recommendations wherein the Senate has power to act, these should be stated at the end of the report, and the proper motion is to adopt the report. If adopted, the resolutions or recommendations shall become policy pending approval or lack of denial by the President of the university.~~

2.9.6: Dissolution

2.9.1. Senate Core eCommittees shall be dissolved by amendingment of the Bylaws.

2.9.2. Senate-approved university eCommittees shall be dissolved by Senate action.

2.9.3. Senate-affiliated Campus Committees may not be dissolved by action of the Senate. If the Senate loses communication with a Senate-affiliated Campus Committee, Senate officers or the Committee on Committees and Elections may issue a memo to the committee's chair requesting clarification as to whether the committee is active or not. If the committee is no longer active, no longer wishes

to be affiliated with the Senate, or there is no response from the campus committee, the Senate Chair or Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections shall make a motion to remove the committee's charter from the University Senate Policy File by majority vote, which shall end their Senate affiliation.

~~2.6.8. Terms of Service on Senate and Senate-Appointed University Committees~~

~~2.6.8.1. Unless otherwise specified, committee members shall serve three-year terms. A committee member may be reappointed. During a committee's initial three years, or as needed to ensure term staggering that is healthy for the continuity of the committee, the Committee on Committees and Elections shall specify members with one-, two-, and three-year seats.~~

~~2.6.8.2. Removal: The Committee on Committees and Elections may recommend the removal of a committee member. Accordingly, the committee member shall be told of the reasons for the proposed removal and shall be given at least two weeks in which to respond. If the Committee on Committees and Elections then determines that removal of the member is in the best interests of the affected committee and of the Senate, it shall recommend to the Senate the name of a replacement member. Appointment of the new nominee by the Senate shall constitute removal of the previous member.~~

~~2.6.8.3. Leave: As soon as a committee member is certain of being granted leave from duties at the university for longer than one semester, that member shall in writing, so inform the Chair of that committee, who in turn shall immediately inform the Secretary of the Senate and the Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections. If the leave is one semester, the Committee on Committees and Elections, in consultation with the committee chair, shall recommend to the Senate a temporary replacement. If the leave is longer than one semester, the Committee on Committees and Elections shall recommend to the Senate a permanent replacement selected according to normal criteria and procedure.~~

RATIONALE:

CBL proposes to streamline the last part of Bylaws 2 and reordered many items. Not all text in red is new policy, some is moved to another spot in the Bylaws. Moreover, some language from the CCE charter has been included. (highlighted in green).

- Section on “Appointive Authority” (2.4.1) We add that seats explicit to Contingent Faculty are nominated by LAC.
- Section on “Removal” (2.5.6.) A concrete list of circumstances is included mimicking those for removal from the Senate. A policy is added that CCE can remove someone from a committee when the person occupies multiple appointed seats on Senate committees and no seat for a senator can be found (this replaces the rule that no one can serve on multiple committees).
- Section on “Committee Chairs eligibility” (2.7.3.) Added language that no one can be elected chair two Senate committees and officers are not allowed to chair Core Committees.
- 2.7.7. was included in “Appointive Authority” section of policy file that was deleted in Fall. It is not new language.
- Sections on “Meetings” (2.8.2.) We do not longer include language on quorum. 2.8.1. states that Senate rules apply to Committees. We encourage committees, in particular Core Committees, to define their quorum rule in their chapter. E.g. when too many seats are vacant it might not be appropriate to meet.
- 2.8.2.5. We suggest that business can be conducted by email given quorum rules are obeyed, but a minimum number of meetings is required (four per semester for Core committees, and one for others). Also, Senate committees have to meet once a year, with no exception. Core Committees four times per semesters.
- Section on “Reports” (2.8.4). Provides information on annual agendas and reports and what they should contain. Provides information on the different ways to submit items for the Senate agenda. CBL also proposes to add a reporting commitment for Core committee chairs.

Passing of this policy change will require that CCE updates its charter.

Senate seat calculations for the 2024/2025 academic year were not implemented correctly. As a result, a number of College/Units were not allocated additional Senate seats to which they were entitled.

Under Policy File Bylaws 6.2.2, such vacancies are filled first by nominees who received the next highest number of votes in the 2024/2025 elections. If no such nominee is available, the affected electorate may recommend a replacement. Any temporary replacement will serve the remainder of the current term, ending in 2028.

As required by Policy File Bylaws 3.5.2, the Committee on Committees & Elections submits for confirmation by the Senate its nominees for members and chairs of Senate and Senate-appointed university committees.

3.5. Committee on Committees and Elections

3.5.1. Membership (156):

3.5.1.1. Appointed (132): nine faculty senators, one from each academic college, SDSU Imperial Valley, and the Library; three additional faculty, one each from the College of Arts and Letters, the College of Professional Studies and Fine Arts, and the College of Sciences², all selected by their respective college senators; ~~and one staff member~~. These members shall be affirmed by vote of the Senate.

3.5.1.2. Ex-officio (24): **The Senate Secretary, or designee; and the President of Associated Students, or designee; the chair of the Staff Affairs Committee; and the Chair of the Lecturer Affairs Committee.**

3.5.1.3. The term of office shall be for one year and begins at the last regular spring meeting of the Senate; it may be extended.

3.5.1.4. The first meeting of each term shall occur immediately following the last spring meeting of the Senate and the outgoing chair shall chair it. The business of the first meeting shall be to elect a successor to the outgoing chair.

Rationale

This change would increase communication channels and better reflects the actual collaboration between the CC&E, the Staff Affairs Committee, and the Lecturer Affairs Committee in filling Senate Committee seats.

Subject: ACTION ITEM: Update to Lecturer Affairs Committee (LAC) Charter (Bylaws)

The following updates to the SDSU University Senate Bylaws are brought forth to the Senate **for a second reading** by the Lecturer Affairs Committee. This requires:

- A first reading by the Senate
- A second reading by the Senate
- 2/3 approval of the Senate

3.11. Lecturer Affairs Committee

3.11.1. Membership (13-20):

3.11.1.1. Ex Officio (13): All Contingent Faculty serving on the SDSU University Senate, including the elected ASCSU Lecturer representative.

3.11.1.2. Appointed (0-7): Up to seven additional at-large Contingent Faculty members from across the university, including Librarian and Student Services Professionals - Academic Related (SSP-AR) faculty members.

3.11.1.3. Members must have a minimum one-year appointment, or have a reasonable expectation that they will be appointed to work during both the fall and spring semesters.

3.11.1.4. Terms for all members shall be three year renewable terms.

3.11.1.5. Quorum requires the presence of at least seven (7) members.

3.11.1.6. No college or unit may have more than 25% of members on the committee at any one time.

~~3.11.1.7. Each year, the chair shall appoint a member of the committee to concurrently serve on the Faculty Affairs Committee.~~

3.11.1.8. A chair shall be elected by members in March of each year to serve for the next academic year.

3.11.2. Functions. The committee shall:

3.11.2.1. Serve as the nominating authority for Contingent Faculty seats to the Senate, Senate Core Committees, Senate Committees, Senate-affiliated Campus Committees, and any other Senate-related appointments designated specifically for Contingent Faculty. Vacancies will be filled in accordance with the policies outlined in the Senate policy file, under Bylaws, section 6.0: Vacancies.

3.11.2.2. Meet ~~regularly~~ **a minimum of four times per semester** to identify, discuss and organize around campus issues that impact the Contingent Faculty constituency.

3.11.2.3. Develop new policy or make recommendations for revisions to existing policy related to Contingent Faculty affairs.

3.11.2.4. Advocate for the inclusion of the Contingent Faculty constituency as part of the decision making and governance on campus, including identifying and recommending Contingent Faculty for placement on senate and other campus committees.

3.11.2.5. Organize the Senate caucus for Contingent Faculty senators.

3.11.2.6. Engage regularly with the Contingent Faculty constituency.

3.11.2.7. Perform other functions that may be required in service of the Contingent Faculty constituency.

3.11.2.8. Known topics that impact the Contingent Faculty constituency include, but are not limited to:

- Service and work completed outside of the scope of contracted teaching. Inclusion in department meetings, collaborations, and decision-making processes.
- Training.
- Contingent Faculty planning and hiring at the university and departmental levels.
- Collecting Contingent Faculty feedback (e.g. surveys) for collaborative decision making, etc.
- Perform a periodic assessment of Contingent Faculty seats on Senate committees to ensure Contingent Faculty interests are represented on key groups and regarding key issues.
- Make recommendations to the Committee on Committees and Elections (CCE) and/or Senate leadership regarding Contingent Faculty participation on Senate committees.

3.11.3. The Chair (or designee) shall report the business of the committee to the Senate.

RATIONALE:

This revision clarifies that LAC is the nominating authority for contingent faculty seats in the University Senate, including for campus committees that seek affiliation with the Senate. Previous language was unclear, and the section outlining this role of LAC should have been listed under functions, rather than membership. Additionally, we added a detail about the minimum frequency of meetings for clarity and to aid/guide future chairs.

**Resolution in Support of San Diego State University
Faculty on H-1B Visas
12/18/2025**

WHEREAS, in September, 2025 the Executive branch announced a new rule that imposes a \$100,000 fee on new H-1B petitions for workers entering from abroad, thus significantly increasing the cost of hiring faculty on H-1B visas;¹ and

WHEREAS, in October, 2025 the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) issued a rule ending automatic renewals of work permits for spouses of H-1B visa holders and other categories of legally authorized non-citizens, thus placing dual-career faculty households at risk of income loss and possible lapse of work status;² and

WHEREAS, in December, 2025 the U.S. Department of State announced expanded screening and vetting for all H-1B applicants and their dependents starting December 15, 2025, instructing all applicants for H-1B visas to “adjust the privacy settings on all of their social media profiles to ‘public;’”³ and

WHEREAS, the additional vetting required by new mandatory social-media screening for all H-1B applicants and their dependents has sharply reduced the number of visa interviews that can be conducted at U.S. consulates each day, triggering mass cancellation of interview slots and leaving some H-1B visa holders stranded abroad with their visa renewal appointments suddenly pushed to March 2026 or later;⁴ and

WHEREAS, the above-mentioned changes to H-1B rules cause undue anxiety and distress for San Diego State University faculty members on H-1B visas and their families, affecting individual well-being and exacerbating uncertainty in an already stressful immigration process; and

WHEREAS, the new H-1B policies mean that international faculty who travel abroad may not be able to re-enter the United States in a timely manner,⁵ making it difficult for them to fully participate in global research, conferences, and collaborations that are essential to academic life; and

WHEREAS, the new H-1B policy hinders the ability of international colleagues to visit aging or ill parents and other family, friends, and community abroad; and

WHEREAS, the new H-1B rules impose unfair and undue burdens on our international colleagues who contribute in such vital ways to the teaching, research, and service missions of SDSU; and

WHEREAS, more than 10 percent of college professors were born outside the U.S., and nearly one in four scientists and one in five computer programmers are college-educated people from other countries;⁶ and

WHEREAS, the American Association of University Professors warns that the new H-1B policy could lead to “catastrophic setbacks” to U.S. research and urged a federal judge to declare the \$100,000 fee unlawful;⁷ and

WHEREAS, California and 19 other states are suing the administration over its policy to charge employers \$100,000 for each new H-1B visa they request, calling it a threat “not only to major industry but also to public education and healthcare services;”⁸ and

WHEREAS, the new \$100,000 fee for H-1B visas imperils San Diego State University’s ability to recruit international faculty, which would severely curtail research and scientific innovation,⁹ reduce diversity and inclusion, and impede SDSU’s dedication to “preparing global citizens, compassionate leaders, and ethical innovators who will help find solutions to the world’s greatest challenges,”¹⁰ and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the SDSU University Senate:

1. stands in solidarity with our colleagues who hold H-1B visas and recognizes their essential role in every aspect of SDSU life;
2. calls upon all SDSU faculty who serve as reviewers for RTP cases to show empathy and understanding to international faculty whose lives and research may have been severely disrupted by the new H1-B rules, and to appropriately support these colleagues as they navigate the new rules.
3. calls upon university leadership to take all possible steps to provide transparent information, clear guidance, and practical support, including legal and financial assistance, to all international faculty affected by the above-mentioned policy changes;
4. encourages President de la Torre to speak publicly about the crucial contributions H1-B faculty make to San Diego State University, and to explain to the broader San Diego community the many ways that curtailing SDSU's ability to recruit international faculty would harm our university and its contributions to the public good;
5. urges the university administration to develop, implement, and communicate a practical plan for providing assistance to international faculty who are unable to return to the United States in a timely manner due to the expanded screening and vetting and related visa interview cancellations;
6. calls on the university administration to permit international faculty who are stranded abroad due to the new H1-B rules to teach all of their courses online until they are able to return to the U.S.;
7. urges the university leadership to be proactive in seeking exemptions from the \$100,000 fee for new hires for whom the university plans to sponsor H-1B visas;¹¹
8. affirms its shared commitment to maintaining an inclusive and globally-engaged academic community, and advocates strongly for the continued hiring of international faculty on H1-B visas.

Rationale:

This resolution is brought forward in response to a series of sudden federal policy changes announced by the Executive branch in Fall 2025 that significantly alter the landscape for H-1B visa holders and the institutions that employ them. Taken together, these changes place substantial financial, logistical, professional, and personal burdens on San Diego State University's international faculty, threaten the university's identity as a globally engaged R1 public institution, and impede its ability to "impart an appreciation and broad understanding of the human experience throughout the world."¹²

The Undergraduate Council met December 1, 2025 in AD 101. In attendance were members Brooks, Dean, Lozada-Santone, Preciado, Molina, Pereira, Hansen, Timm, Donyanavard, Torre, Alves.

The Council received standing reports from [Christine Molina](#) on advising and Jose Preciado on our General Studies program. Our AS representatives also provided additional reports requested by the Council on ways to streamline bureaucratic obstacles to undergraduate success, indicating strong desire for an AI-supported system capable of generating multi-semester roadmaps for student course schedules. The Council is happy to note that the UAchieve platform providing this functionality will be implemented at SDSU in Fall 2026.

Upon invitation from AP&P, the Council reviewed the draft [AP&P: Academic Partnership Agreement](#).

It also received updates on the status of several efforts to ensure proper recognition of lecturer faculty in the undergraduate education mission, including a Policy File update co-sponsored with LAC and FAC, which has been returned to FAC for additional work upon recommendation from SEC, as well as the newly launched [CTL Lecturer Teaching Awards](#) due February 6 and the [ExCEL Community Engaged Learning Awards](#), deadline extended to January.

Continuing its conversation of the new CSU [Systemwide Student Success Framework](#), the Council continued to think through various opportunities to mitigate obstacles, including

- updates to first-year seminar curriculum to help students learn to read their degree evaluations
- Updates to the degree evaluation format to support better understanding
- Addressing “GE Bloat” on degree evaluations—i.e., fifty course options listed for each GE requirement
- Addressing redundancy, overwhelm, and divergence in the university student information ecosystem

Finally, the Council received presentations from IS3D students Mark Sotelo, Gianni Grimm, and Allie Smith of their final capstone IS3D presentations, highlighting effective curricular supports for student career preparation and development.

Mission Statement

The Campanile Foundation provides San Diego State University with the community expertise, oversight, and advocacy to increase private giving and manage the philanthropic assets of the University.

History of the Campanile Foundation

The Campanile Foundation incorporated as a philanthropic tax-exempt foundation [a 501(c)(3) corporation] and an official auxiliary of San Diego State in August 1999. The Foundation plays an important role in SDSU's long-term strategy and institutional commitment to increase private funding.

To accomplish this goal, The Campanile Foundation and the SDSU Research Foundation have created an operating alliance to implement this philanthropic strategy in the most effective manner. The Campanile Foundation outsources its accounting and account administration functions to the SDSU Research Foundation to prevent the duplication of existing services and expertise that could lead to increases in the cost of administering gifts.

The Foundation has played a key role in helping the endowment surpass the \$500 million mark since its inception. Gifts from corporations, foundations and individuals fuel new and existing initiatives, benefiting students and global communities—thus creating a synergistic cycle.

Board Leadership

Providing leadership to The Campanile Foundation is a Board of Directors made up of highly qualified civic and business leaders, most of whom are San Diego State alumni, who give their personal expertise, time and treasure to support SDSU. Board members are elected for three-year terms, with the exception of a one-year term for student, faculty and alumni representatives.

Julie Dillon, President of Dillon Development, Inc., is the current chair. As volunteer leaders of San Diego State University, board members are expected to demonstrate philanthropic leadership through a personal financial commitment and by actively engaging in the university's fundraising initiatives. In addition, each member serves on a subcommittee that fits their area of interest and serves as an ambassador for the university. Corporate Officers for the Campanile Foundation include President and CEO, Adrienne Vargas; CFO, Travis Clancy; and Secretary, Cynthia Swanson.

Board Structure

The Campanile Foundation Board conducts its business through the following committees:

Executive Committee: Comprised of the Campanile Foundation Board Chair, Chair-elect or Immediate Past Chair and Vice Chairs of each committee. This committee acts with the full authority of the board between meetings and advises the CEO on operations.

Nominating and Governance Committee: Standing committee responsible for identifying and recruiting distinguished community members and evaluating the organizational needs of the Board.

Finance and Investment Committee: Standing committee monitors financial reporting, sets investment policy, and evaluates investment performance.

Audit Committee: Standing committee responsible for oversight of the Foundation's quality and integrity of the financial statements, compliance with legal and regulatory requirements, and the independence and performance of the external auditors.

Government and Community Relations: This special committee is responsible for supporting SDSU's mission through advocacy, issue management, and serving as a liaison with governmental and community entities and external constituencies.

Athletics Committee: This special committee is charged with advising the President and SDSU's Athletic Director on athletic recruiting and to provide fundraising assistance for athletic scholarships, endowment, and capital projects. The committee also works with the Athletics department to help enhance and continuously build competitive programs.

Arts Committee: This special committee is charged with raising awareness, visibility, recognition, and support for SDSU's arts programs, students, and faculty. The committee also assists in implementing arts projects and programs that advance the welfare of the San Diego region that enrich the community with resulting economic and social benefits.

Stewardship Committee: This special committee is charged with determining best practices to steward donors for SDSU.
