The Academic Policy and Planning Committee (AP&P) moves that the Senate adopt the following changes to the Senate Policy File Bylaws, Committees - **Second Reading:**

Bylaws, Committees

3.0 Standing Committees: Membership and Duties

- 3.3. Committee on Academic Policy and Planning
 - 3.3.1. Membership (1615)
 - 3.3.1.1. Ex officio (voting): the Provost and Senior Vice President, or designee; the Associate Vice President for Faculty Advancement and Student Success; Senate Chair, or designee; and the Dean of Graduate Studies, or designee.
 - 3.3.1.2. Appointed: nine faculty members, one from each academic college, the Library, and SDSU Imperial Valley, nominated by the Committee on Committees and Elections and appointed by the Senate, at least two of whom shall be elected senators; one staff member-selected by the Staff Affairs Committee in consultation with the staff senators and confirmed by the Senate; and two students appointed in accordance with procedures established by the Associated Students.

Rationale:

At the end of AY 2022-2023, AP&P was asked to consider adding the Senate Chair or designee as a member to the committee to ensure communication and efficiency related to policy updates and committee administration for the Senate. Senate Officers are already members of URP, DEI and other standing committees. AP&P agreed that adding the Senate Chair to AP&P's roster would help facilitate committee work by improving communication between the committee and officers. Changes to 3.3.1.2. are suggested to remove redundancy with other parts of the bylaws, given that AP&P committee assignments are made in accordance with process and requirements stated elsewhere. Subject: Bylaws 2.6.2 (referral 59 2020/21) Update Committee Chair Policies:

The CBL moves that the Senate adopt the following changes to Senate policy file (Bylaws) for a 2^{nd} reading.

BYLAWS 2.6.2

2.6.2. Chair: Procedures for selection and rotation of a committee chair shall be specified by the Senate. Where no other provision is made, the chair shall be the first person appointed or elected to the committee. When the chair resigns or is removed from the committee or fails to serve, the committee shall elect a chair pro tempore and notify the Committee on Committees and Elections.

2.6.2. Committee Chairs

2.6.2.1. Election: Unless otherwise specified, committees shall elect a chair annually by April 1 for the upcoming academic year. The current chair will oversee the election. The voting members of the committee shall elect the chair. The Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections and the Secretary of the Senate shall be notified and included in the committee's annual report, or when any change in committee leadership occurs.

2.6.2.2. An ex-officio member shall not be named chair unless otherwise specified by the committee's charter.

2.6.2.3. If no member of the committee is willing to serve as chair, the Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections or the Chair of the Senate may appoint a new chair. This appointment may result in a member being replaced by a chair from outside the committee.

2.6.2.4. A chair can be vacated by a majority vote of the entire voting membership of the committee..

2.6.2.5. When the chair is vacated before the expiration of a term, the remaining committee members elect a new chair.

Rationale:

Clarifies when new chair is selected and notification requirements.

Specifies what to do when no one volunteers to chair. The current rule that the longest serving committee member needs to step up does not really work (in particular for a time-consuming committee when buyout is involved). In practice the chair of CCE and Senate get involved and try to find someone willing to chair. Sometimes they have to look further than the current committee members. The new policy specifies that in this case the chair found from outside needs to replace a current committee member (e.g. someone from the College of the new outside chair).

2.6.2.4 outlines procedures to be followed in the rare occasion that a chair does not function.

The CBL committee discussed adding rules on cochairs but decided against formulating any as an official policy. We believe advising on cochairs is best left in the hands of CCE. The final decision always rests with the Senate floor.

3.6.1 Membership (14-15):

3.6.1.1 Appointed (12 13): nine faculty senators, one from each academic college, SDSU Imperial Valley, and the Library; and three additional faculty, one each from the College of Arts and Letters, the College of Professional Studies and Fine Arts, and the College of Sciences²; all selected by their respective college senators; and one staff member selected by the Staff Affairs Committee in consultation with staff Senators. These members shall be selected by their respective college senators and affirmed by vote of the Senate.

3.6.1.2 Ex-officio (2): Chair of the Staff Affairs Committee, or designee; Senate Secretary, or designee; and the President of Associated Students, or designee.

RATIONALE: Senate Officers are members of URP, DEI and other standing committees. This membership enhances the officers' ability to ensure the work of the Senate proceeds in a timely and efficient manner, it increases communication and provides a consistent avenue for communication regarding important business of the Senate. Senate officers accept the additional responsibility and these committee chairs are in support of the expanded membership. Additionally, moving the staff member to be parallel to the other elected members of the committee mirrors existing language for other standing committees.

The December 2023 graduation application filing period was from April 24, 2023 to September 1, 2023. In accordance with the Senate policy, lists of baccalaureate degree candidates for December 2023 graduation have been distributed. Lists of advanced degree candidates for December 2023 graduation, as approved by the Graduate Council, have also been distributed. Each faculty member has been given the opportunity to approve or disapprove the candidates by ballot.

Undergraduate Graduation Candidates - The Office of the Registrar sent two email notifications (5/25/2023 and 8/17/2023) to students with 85+ units earned or in the second bachelor's degree nursing program about the method and deadline to apply for December 2023 graduation. Once the student submits a completed graduation application, they'll receive a notification to their SDSUid email address confirming the receipt of their application and the graduation term they've applied for. The student's graduation application is then forwarded to their assigned Graduation Advisor in the Office of the Registrar who'll review their academic record, assess their remaining degree requirements, and note any missing requirements at the bottom of the degree evaluation. Once the student's academic record has been evaluated the student will receive an email notifying them their graduation evaluation has been completed and to review their degree evaluation. The student may then work with their major/minor advisor(s) or graduation advisor if they have any inquiries about their graduation evaluation or progress towards their bachelor's degree completion.

After September 2, 2023 and by November 1, 2023, a student who has a serious and compelling reason may request to submit a late December 2023 undergraduate graduation application by contacting the Office of the Registrar. Between November 2, 2023 and December 29, 2023 (official last day of Fall 2023), late applications are only accepted with the support of the Assistant Dean. The graduation advisor will assess if the student's request is appropriate (e.g., degree evaluation shows they're in their final semester/term's classes required to complete the bachelor's degree) and inform the student of the next steps regarding the graduation application process.

For the December 2023 undergraduate graduation process, the auto-graduation job will be run after the Fall 2023 semester ends and the Office of the Registrar has completed the certification of Fall 2023 grades. Provided the student has met all graduation requirements between my.SDSU student information system and uAchieve degree evaluation, their December 2023 bachelor's degree will be posted to their SDSU transcript. All students will receive a notification to their SDSUid email address regarding their graduation status (i.e., graduated, pending, or canceled) with the university in January 2024. For the students with the pending or canceled graduation status, the graduation advisors will connect with them regarding the next steps in

order for them to successfully complete their bachelor's degree requirements. If the degree requirements will not be met by the end of the 6 week deadline to confer degrees in accordance with the deadline of ERS reporting, the student's graduation application will be transferred to the next graduation term.

Graduate Graduation Candidates

Graduate Studies makes several attempts to notify graduate students of upcoming applications for the fall graduation deadline of September 1, 2023. Graduate Studies sent two email notifications to students on August 18, 2023 and August 28, 2023. The email notification provides students with the deadline to apply for Fall 2023 graduation, associated fee, commencement information, and mailing address information. Application for graduation deadlines are included on the announcement section and the deadline flier located on the Graduate Studies website. This information was available on our website as of August 1, 2023 as well as the SDSU Graduate Students Canvas homeroom. Lastly, an announcement is sent to graduate advisors/directors as part of the graduate advisor email notice that is sent by the Associate/Assistant Dean of Graduate Studies.

Graduation Evaluations were generated and emailed to advisors and students that applied to graduate by the original application deadline of September 1, 2023, as well as included students that paid by the late application deadline of September 30, 2023. The "Graduation Evaluation" job is a bulk process that generates degree audits for applicants. The assigned Graduate Evaluator will review the student's record and verify remaining degree requirements. The Graduate Evaluators will make necessary comments on the student's graduation evaluation or make necessary adjustments to the student's individualized record. Once the student's graduation evaluation was completed, Graduate Studies emailed students their Graduation Evaluation. The Graduation Evaluation outlined a student's outstanding degree requirements and deadlines by when those requirements needed to be completed. Students are advised to contact our office or work with their Graduation Advisor if they have any inquiries about their graduation evaluation or progress towards the completion of their degree. Graduate Studies continued to receive applications for graduation several months after the original application deadline. Graduate Studies set a September 30, 2023 for late applications for students that had missed the original September 1, 2023 deadline. This allowed students to apply late with an additional late fee. There was a second late application that required students to petition for graduation. The petition process began after the late application which ended on September 30 deadline and ran through November 18, 2023. Students petitioning to apply for late graduation were required to include a letter of support from the graduate advisor outlining the students remaining requirements, if any, and the timeframe of the outstanding degree requirements that will be completed. This informs Graduate Studies of any outstanding department deadlines/requirements in order for the student to be recommended for graduation.

Receiving a recommendation from the program advisor will assist with determining if it is appropriate that the student apply to graduate or defer graduation for an additional semester due to outstanding degree requirements. If a student is on track to complete their degree

requirement by the end of the term, their petition for late graduation is approved. Students that were approved to apply late were required to submit an application for graduation by November 18, 2023 and pay the application fee, along with the late fee, no later than November 30, 2023. Students were notified if they do not pay the late application fee by November 30, 2023, their Fall 2023 graduation application will be rolled over to the Spring 2024 semester for evaluation. All students that had applied to graduate by November 6, 2023 were included in the senate ballot that was also sent out to Department Chairs, Commencement Coordinators, Graduate Advisors, and Assistant Deans of each college on November 6, 2023. Students who did not pay the graduation fee by November 6th but paid before November 30, 2023 were not included in the ballot that was sent out on November 6, 2023 but have been included in the number count of Fall 2023 applicants. It is worth noting that at this time our office has not had any inquiries from students trying to graduate after having missed the November 18, 2023 deadline. After the Fall 2023 semester ends on December 29, 2023 and the Office of the Registrar has completed end of term verification, Graduate Studies will run their graduation job. Provided the student has met all graduation requirements, their Fall 2023 degree will be posted to their SDSU transcript. The exceptions to this are Joint Doctoral Students as our office is required to consult with our joint partners at the end of the joint campus' term that a student is eligible for graduation. All students will receive a notification to their SDSUid email address notifying them when their diploma has been mailed out and to what address it was sent to. For students that are not eligible for graduation, Graduate Studies will email the student a cancellation notification. The Graduation Cancellation Notice provides the student with the specific reason as to why their graduation was canceled. Students are encouraged to contact our office or their Graduate Advisor to discuss necessary steps to remediate outstanding degree requirements. Graduation Cancellation Notices are sent out within two to three weeks after the end of the semester. Students that have their graduation canceled will automatically be re-evaluated for graduation for the subsequent term.

The Tenure-Track Planning Committee (TTPC) moves that the Senate adopt the following changes to UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Committees and Councils, Tenure-Track Planning Committee and UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Faculty, Tenure-Track Planning:

UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Committees and Councils

Tenure-Track Planning Committee

- 1.0 Membership (10+): Chair of the Senate, Chair of Academic Policy and Planning, Chair of University Resources and Planning, Chair of Faculty Affairs, Chair of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. For colleges not otherwise represented among these Senate positions, membership will be augmented with a tenured or probationary faculty representative from each missing college planning committee to ensure that each college has at least one representative on the Tenure-Track Planning Committee. Colleges represented shall be: Arts and Letters, Education, Engineering, Fowler College of Business, Health and Human Services, Professional Studies and Fine Arts, Sciences, Library, and Imperial Valley.
 - 1.1. The Chair of the Tenure-Track Planning Committee will determine any gaps and coordinate with the Chair of the Committee on Committees and Elections (CCE). CCE will oversee the filling of vacancies within the relevant colleges.
 - 1.2. Members are not required to be current Senators.
 - 1.3. The Provost shall serve in an advisory capacity to the committee.
- **2.0** Function and Process: The Committee shall annually consider the Senate's Tenure-Track Planning Policy and programming initiatives, review requests and supporting documentation, and recommend to the Provost the allocation of new and vacated tenured and probationary faculty positions.

- 2.1. The Provost should provide to the Tenure-Track Planning Committee in the Spring semester the number of hires and search proposals for searches that will launch in the following academic year. If final budgetary information is unavailableIn the event final budgetary information is not available, the number of vacated faculty lines, new hires, and search proposals will be shared with the Tenure-Track Planning Committee as soon as possible.
- 2.2. Each committee member will solicit feedback from their respective college planning committee about the process of shared governance utilized in each college's planning process. That information will be shared with the entire Tenure-Track Planning Committee as part of the committee's overall recommendations.
- 2.3. The Tenure-Track Planning Committee will make its preliminary recommendations by the end of the spring semester based on the guidelines of the Tenure-Track Planning Policy, Building on Inclusive Excellence faculty hiring program policy, and any other relevant policies or directives.
- **3.0 Recommendation:** After appropriate consultation with the Tenure-Track Planning Committee, the Provost shall determine and communicate to the university a decision concerning the allocation of the distribution of new faculty lines across academic affairs. The Provost shall report back to the Tenure-Track Planning Committee and the full Senate the final set of positions allocated in each hiring cycle, and shall justify decisions that deviate from the recommendations of the TTPC.
- **4.0 Cluster Hires:** The Tenure-Track Planning Committee shall be involved in the establishment of University-wide cluster hires as described in section 6.1 of UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Faculty, Tenure-Track Planning.

UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Faculty

Tenure-Track Planning

- 1.0 History of Tenure: When colleges and universities were initially established, they were designed for the elite, specifically elite Euroamerica males¹², and faculty were from that same privileged group. All faculty were hired as contingent faculty through the early twentieth century. During the 1920-40s, and as middle-class men had access to higher education and as labor movements grew more and more successful across the country, tenure was established toin order to recruit and retain faculty. It was initially established as a right, with faculty achieving it after being employed for a certain length of time. This changed after the civil rights movement, which opened more access to diverse people and women in colleges and universities. In the 1970s tenure shifted to being a privilege that was conferred upon specific individuals and complex structures were established that served to maintain the status quo of white male privilege. Currently, the numbers of tenured and tenure-track faculty are dwindling across the country, in part because of these privileges, the changing demographics of the country, and shifting access and equity issues. Higher education continues to become more elite, even though the majority of courses on campus are being taught by contingent full- and part-time lecturers and teaching assistants. The American Association of University Professors (AAUP) affirms the importance of tenure in its 1940 Statement of Principles on Academic Freedom and Tenure, and affirms the need to increase tenure-stream hiring while also improving conditions for contingent faculty¹³.
- 2.0 The university shall adopt a specific planning goal to establish the proportion of probationary and tenured faculty to 85 percent of the total of the university's full-time equivalent faculty (FTEF). Each college shall formally examine its philosophy, mission, and pedagogies concerning in relation to this proportion.
- 3.0 To meet this goal the university shall need to (a) refill the tenure-track positions that become vacant through retirements, resignations, terminations, and deaths, and (b) strive to maintain the percent proportion articulated above in 2.0.
 - 3.1. With the growth of contingent faculty nationally, which disproportionately and adversely impacts faculty of color and female-identified faculty, the university has an ethical responsibility to create pathways for contingent

faculty positions to convert into tenure-track positions whenever possible. There are multiple possible pathways, including prioritizing contingent faculty candidates in tenure-track searches, converting contingent faculty to tenure-track lines, and ensuring that the university does not exceed the recommended total percentage of contingent faculty appointments in any department.

- 3.2. As an additional equity measure, the university should pursue longer contracts for contingent faculty whenever possible and as allowed by the collective bargaining agreement. Barriers to contract renewal should be eliminated, and the renewal process should be fair, equitable, and transparent for all contingent faculty.
- 4.0 This tenure-track renewal initiative shall become the university's highest fiscal priority.
 - 4.1. Per Enrollment Management and Impaction policy, section 5.0, enrollment management and tenure track planning shall be treated as interconnected matters of shared governance. Insofar as enrollment impacts the workload of all faculty, hiring practices and ratios between probationary, tenured, and contingent faculty must be a factor in consultative decision-making about enrollment management. Conversely, enrollment management is a central factor in tenure track planning and should be prioritized alongside faculty-student ratios and other programmatic or curricular needs.
- 5.0 The allocation of tenure-track positions shall be tied to programmatic planning by departments, schools, programs, and colleges, aligned with Building on Inclusive Excellence (BIE) criteria. Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) must be a factor of consideration.
 - 5.1 Per 12.22.c in the Collective Bargaining Agreement, contingent faculty who receive an offer of tenure-track employment at another institution may be recommended for a probationary faculty unit appointment in a department with no current tenure-line recruitment. Such appointments shall not be considered part of the broader tenure track planning process due to the timeliness of the employment offer. Colleges may use existing funding to make a comparable hiring offer to the contingent faculty member without going through the full planning process. The relevant college-level shared governance committees shall be consulted in this

process, and the appropriate departmental peer review committee shall conduct the review.

- 6.0. University strategic planning goals and priorities may be considered in the allocation of tenure-track positions. The Tenure-Track Planning Committee shall play an advisory role in determining these hiring priorities, including interdisciplinary and/or cross-college clusters.
 - 6.1. In the event of a University-wide cluster hire, the Tenure-Track Planning Committee, in consultation with the Provost and the Committee on Committee and Elections (CCE), will determine the membership of an adhoc multidisciplinary cluster hire committee. This committee will oversee the determination of specific research areas for potential searches, as well as the formation of subsequent search committees.
- 76.0 After appropriate consultation with the Tenure-Track Planning Committee, the Provost shall determine and communicate to the university a policy concerning the allocation of new and vacated tenure-track positions in a timely manner that aligns with the competitive nature of tenure-track searches across the country.

Rationale

The Tenure Track Planning Committee (TTPC) recommends several updates and revisions to the Policy File related to committee functions (UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Committees and Councils, Tenure-Track Planning Committee) and broad principles of tenure track planning (UNIVERSITY POLICIES: Faculty, Tenure-Track Planning) in order to strengthen shared governance processes. These updates clarify and strengthen the TTPC's role in determining hiring priorities in each planning cycle, create greater transparency in the decision-making process for allocating new faculty lines, connect hiring priorities to enrollment management, clarify processes and procedures for recommending and pursuing interdisciplinary cluster hires, and align our policy with new provisions in the Collective Bargaining Agreement related to converting contingent faculty into tenure-track lines when appropriate. These changes further clarify that such decisions to convert contingent faculty to tenure-track lines will not go through the full campuswide tenure track planning process due to the timeliness of the need.

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY SENATE RESOLUTION REAFFIRMING THE CONDEMNATION OF ANTISEMITISM ON CAMPUS

WHEREAS, On July 21, 2021, the Senate Executive Committee passed a resolution on behalf of the SDSU University Senate condemning antisemitism, stating that "the SDSU University Senate explicitly condemns antisemitism both in itself and as contradictory to the University's Diversity Equity and Inclusion mission, which rejects all forms of discrimination and exclusion based on identity"; and

WHEREAS, since the Senate passed the resolution, there have been multiple antisemitic incidents on and around this campus; and

WHEREAS, since the Senate passed the resolution, the menorah outside SDSU Chabad House was again vandalized on March 26, 2023; and

WHEREAS, since the Senate passed the resolution, on November 9, the leading non-partisan U.S based organization StopAntisemitism circulated a video on X, formerly Twitter, showing two people on the SDSU campus ripping down fliers of Israeli children¹ kidnapped by Hamas during the group's unspeakable acts of terror perpetrated on October 7; and

WHEREAS, The removal of said fliers is not an act of free speech but, on the contrary, an act that Greg Lukianoff, president and CEO of the Foundation for Individual Rights and Expression (FIRE) has dubbed, "the physical manifestation of a heckler's veto,"² one that is profoundly anti speech, speech that is against speech, that effectively denies legitimate advocacy for nearly 240 Israeli victims kidnapped by Hamas; and

WHEREAS, On November 10, the official Twitter account of San Diego State University responded by sending a four-part tweet that began: "SDSU is aware of a video circulating on social media capturing an individual removing posters on campus." While the University says that "The reported actions do not align with the university's principles and may violate CSU anti-discrimination policies,"³ the University's tweets do not explicitly state that tearing down the posters constitutes an antisemitic act by implicitly effacing the nearly 240 Israeli victims kidnapped by Hamas; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the SDSU Senate reaffirm and reiterate its commitment to make this a safe and welcoming campus environment for all faculty, staff, and students, including Jewish faculty, staff, and students; and

RESOLVED, That the SDSU Senate reaffirm and reiterate its condemnation of antisemitism, especially in light of the surge of antisemitism witnessed on university campuses in the United States and around the world since the October 7 massacre of Israelis by Hamas, with an

estimated death toll of approximately 1,200 people, mainly civilians⁴—the most lethal assault against Jews since the Shoah (שואה). Endorsed by:



This memo is in response to the Senate Referral to "Provide Report on Impact of AI."

This report addresses the University Senate Referral 22/23_21 by establishing an AI subcommittee within the Information & Instructional Technology Committee. This subcommittee focuses on responding to the SDSU Senate Referral and the <u>Academic Senate of the</u> <u>California State University (ASCSU) Resolution</u> and associated call for generative AI Literacy professional development to foster faculty dialogue and reflection.

The specific aims of the AI Subcommittee at SDSU were to:

- Describe opportunities, limitations, and ethical considerations associated with AI in education to inform the development of responsible AI policies or guidelines.
- Leverage insights from SDSU's AI Student Survey in shaping future policies, practices, and heuristics.
- Provide input on SDSU's new Academic Applications of AI (AAAI) Micro-Credential Program designed to prepare faculty for the responsible use of generative artificial intelligence. This review is helping to ensure that AI applications in the classroom and research align with ethical standards.
- Conduct a comprehensive review of SDSU's <u>existing institutional policies</u> that may relate to the instructional use of AI and academic integrity. This is essential for aligning university policies with the evolving landscape of AI in education.

San Diego State University (SDSU) has undertaken activities and initiatives to address and inform the Senate Referral in response to faculty requests for AI policy recommendations. The university's efforts are centered on understanding student needs, fostering responsible AI use, and enhancing the academic experience. Here is a high-level recap of Fall 2023 activities and recommendations for moving forward:

- <u>AI Student Survey</u>: SDSU initiated a comprehensive campus-wide AI Student Survey, involving all students, and had 7,811 respondents representing more than a 20% response rate. The purpose is to gain a deep understanding of student needs and expectations regarding AI in education.
- 2. <u>Al Faculty and Student Fellows</u>: The subcommittee collaborated with dedicated Al Faculty and Student Fellows to tap insights from those with expertise in Al.

- 3. <u>Academic Applications of AI (AAAI) Micro-Credential Program</u>: SDSU's Academic Application of AI (AAAI) Micro-Credential was designed by faculty for faculty and prepares faculty to apply Generative AI technology efficiently, effectively, and ethically to level up learning in the classes they teach. This program serves as a guide for responsible uses of generative AI in both classroom and research applications. It equips faculty with the knowledge and skills for responsible AI integration into education.
- 4. <u>Academic Applications of Al Summit 2024</u>: SDSU will host an event on April 12, 2024, and invite members of the campus community to collaborate, share knowledge, and advance Al-enabled instruction.
- 5. <u>Generative AI (gAI) Guidelines</u>: Given disciplinary differences¹ (Giovanni, et al, 2023), and the rapidly changing frontier, as well as the fact that the CSU Chancellor's Office is currently exploring the need to provide campuses with policy guidance, the subcommittee is recommending that SDSU adopt a holistic approach to academic AI. The focus of the recommendation is on providing instructors with guidance on <u>syllabus</u> <u>language</u> and strategies (a) that they can use or adapt to enhance the student learning experience by, when appropriate, leveraging gAI technologies; or (b) for moderating/limiting the use of gAI to protect key learning objectives. The former may include personalizing instruction, adapting to individual student needs, and fostering engagement and success.

In summary, the Subcommittee's approach to addressing concerns about AI in education is marked by combining data-driven decision-making, collaboration with key stakeholders, faculty training, and a commitment to ethical and responsible AI use. These efforts are geared towards enhancing the academic experience for both students and faculty.





- Spring 2024 registration is ongoing, running ahead of prior years, and tracking towards target.
- SDSU projects we will be ~1.3% above our Academic Year FTES target (inclusive of summer 2023, fall 2023 and spring 2024).
- SDSU has received a record number of first-year applications, more than 90,000, which is the most in the CSU system.
- Graduate applications are running significantly ahead of fall 2023 levels, which may be partially (though not entirely) due to programs having earlier application deadlines.
- Graduate admissions staff are pacing far ahead of last year in preparing files for faculty review.


