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changes due to "BBB". Parent+ Loan is capped; totally eliminating Grad+ Loan; Lifetime Graduate Loan is capped; Professional Program Loan is capped. ROI on low-earning degree programs was the largest portion of discussion. Studio Art and Teacher Ed. were singled out at SDSU. Will participate in DOEd pilot programs related to these issues and determining how much alumni earn within 1 year, 5 years, etc... after graduation. Questions from Sen. Butler-Byrd with regards to how SDSU will participate in this. Sen. Fuller asked about H1-B visas and affiliated costs as regards faculty. Provost Tong noted that universities are exempt from some of the restrictions placed on private companies. Sen. Cosmay asked with regards to threats to SDSU from the current administration. Provost replied yes, in many different ways (e.g. grant cuts; FNA 15% cap) . Dean Love clarified the question as to whether particular CSUs were targeted; Sen. Hernandez added further clarification as to targeted CSUs. Provost is aware of the situation. Sen. Schuermann asked as to ROI and how we are participating in DOEd program and how creative SDSU can be in response. Provost replied that measures were being taken to thoughtfully reply to DOEd initiatives emphasizing relatively low cost of attending SDSU relative to educational outcomes.
