The updates and revisions made from the last meeting were reviewed by **Chair Butler Byrd**. **Barbone** raises some concerns about the language and disagrees with some of the whereas clauses. **Fuller** noted that the taskforce should not be duplicated with the one recently established by the President.

Motion (**Csomay/Barbone**) to amend by moving the "Whereas" clauses to the rationale and leave only the "Resolved" clauses. There was some discussion for and against, with a lot of sentiment that the administration itself needs to be held more accountable and be held to a standard of transparency. The secondary motion fails (**11 Yes | 26 No | 23 Abstain**).

Motion (Adams/Fuller) to amend by the language to state "the" Gender Based Violence

Task Force rather than "a" task force accepted as a friendly edit.

Original motion (**Butler Byrd/Schuermann**) to approve this resolution passed (**55 Yes | 7 No | 8 Abstain**).
