


# Active Shooter Safety FBI's Report

FBI's Report on Active Shooter Incidents in the United States in 2021 (Published March 2022):

- An active shooter is defined as "one or more individuals actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a populated area."
- The FBI designated 61 shootings in 30 different states as active shooter incidents.
- Active shooter incidents have increased from 2017 to 2021.

Active Shooter Incidents 2017-2021







#### Our Aztec Community Policing and Safety Philosophy: Environment

Through the use of personnel, policies and technology, the university's goal is to create an environment that promotes the safety, wellbeing and security for all.

### Addressing Criminal Activity Policing and Safety Philosophy: Enforcement

UPD officers take criminal activity seriously and work with allied police departments and other public safety departments to address crime on and near campus.

#### **During Active Shooter incidents,**

- Law enforcement officials are focused on immediately stopping the threat
- Emergency responders and officers will form rescue teams to treat and transport people with injuries
- Officials may ask community members to remain in area until a situation is under control
- Emergency Alerts

- Reengaging the Active Shooter Safety Task Force to update the University-Specific Active Shooter Safety Video
- Implemented 50% of a **new campus-wide Access Control System (ACS)** utilizing advanced technology
- Formed the **Safety and Security Infrastructure Committee** (SASIC) with dedicated funding
