I receive the following actions from the University Senate meeting which occurred November 10th, 2020, and delivered as action memos to the Office of the President on September 1, 2021.

6.1. Resolution: Resolution in Opposition to Title 5 Restructuring of General Education and in Acknowledgement of SDSU's Ethnic Studies Requirement's Alignment with AB 1460, noting that the Senate Secretary reported that the motion carried with 82 yes votes; 2 against; with no abstentions.

I approve the following actions from the University Senate meeting which occurred November 10th, 2020, and delivered as action memos to the Office of the President on September 1, 2021.

6.3. Proposed Policy: Permit students to request Credit/No Credit grading option until Dec. 10th 2020 for courses that already allow for Credit/No Credit, noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this motion carried with a vote of 56 yes, 7 no, and 6 abstention.

6.4. Constitution and Bylaws Consultation: Renaming of Graduate Affairs: Constitution and Bylaws Committee [20/21_18] and Update to the Policy File regarding Campus/College designations (Response to Referral by Senate Officers [19/20_13]), noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this was passed unanimously.

6.5. Graduate Council- Name Change: Division of Graduate Affairs to College of Graduate Studies, noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this motion carried with a vote of 34 yes, 8 no, and 17 abstentions.

6.6. Graduate Council- Approval of courses and programs, noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this was passed unanimously.

6.7. Addition of new voting member to University Resources & Planning [20/21_12], noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this motion carries with 43 yes, 3 no, and 7 abstentions.

6.8. CBL committee moves that Fulltime Faculty be defined as tenured and probationary faculty, noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this motion carries with 44 yes, 1 no, and 6 abstentions.

6.9. UCC committee moved approval of new courses and programs, noting that the Senate Secretary reports that this was passed unanimously.
