I approve the following actions from the Senate meeting on November 7, 2017.

# 1. Item 7.1 Report of the Committee on Committees and Elections

The Senate approved various appointments or reappointments to Senate Committees, Councils, etc.

### 2. Item 7.3 Report of the General Education Committee

The Senate approved reconsideration of two courses inadvertently approved in October:

- AE 460A: Aerospace Engineering Applications (addition of existing course to GE/IV: Explorations of the Human Experience—B. Social and Behavioral Sciences)
- ME 490A: Engineering Design: Senior Project (addition of existing course to GE and change to course description and grading method/IV: Explorations of the Human Experience—B. Social and Behavioral Sciences)

The Senate approved postponing consideration of one course detailed in the report:

• CIV E 495: Capstone Design Project (IV: Explorations of the Human Experience/B. Social and Behavioral Sciences)—so that all five Engineering courses could be discussed as a package (*ultimately, not approved*).

The Senate approved the following *new* requests in the report:

- SOC 335: Sociology of Popular Culture (IV: Explorations of the Human Experience—B. Social and Behavioral Sciences -- change to description and title)
- HUM 410: Studies in Popular Culture<sup>1</sup> (IV: Explorations of the Human Experience— C. Humanities – new course)
- HUM 411: Evil (IV: Explorations of the Human Experience—C. Humanities new course)<sup>2</sup>

### 3. Item 7.4 Report of the (Faculty) Honors and Awards Committee

The Senate approved the following requests for emeritus status:

- Ronald W. Evans, Professor of Teacher Education; December 30, 2017; 28 years

## 4. Item 7.2 Report of the Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Outreach

Via a paper ballot, the Senate approved a resolution to eliminate the mascot and form a task force to investigate the Aztec identity.

In noting this item, I commit to initiating a comprehensive, inclusive discussion that will provide me additional information to consider in 1) making a decision on the mascot, and 2) reaching conclusions and determining actions regarding the Aztec Identity in general.

I will immediately seek nominations of seven faculty and staff to be nominated by the Senate; seven individuals to be nominated by the Alumni Association; and seven students to be nominated by the Associated Students. I will select four from each group to serve on a Task Force to make recommendations both as to the Mascot and as to the Aztec Identity issue. Additionally, I will appoint a fifth member to each group and two members at large, for a total of seventeen task force members.

It is my intent that the Task Force will complete its work by the end of April so that I can make my final determinations prior to the end of the current academic year.
